Pastor's Message:

Priming the Pump of Praise

My mother often mentioned that she grew up drinking spring water that she drew from a well. Often she would have to prime the pump. There was a bucket of water that always sat beside the well. After pouring in a little water, the pump would start to produce water. Pouring in a little made a whole lot come out.

As we give a little of ourselves and pour out our love to God, our praise to God, our service to God, a lot happens.

If there are particular areas in **your** life that you are longing and thirsting for a blessing, know that whatever it is, God cares. Also being collected are towels, washcloths, toiletries, adult diapers, and gift cards for Walmart and Giant for food and medicine for families with handicapped members. Donations can be brought up until April 14, when they will be displayed in the sanctuary.

Missionary Support

During the recent visit of our missionaries in Tanzania, Mutwale and Kabaka shared the importance of supporting not only their salaries but also the mission projects they are working on. Hints for Healthy Living

April is national distracted driving awareness month. There are 3 kinds of distracted driving: taking your eyes off the road, your hands off the wheel, and your mind off your driving. About 3000 people die in crashes involving distracted drivers every year in the U.S. To prevent injuries, avoid multi-tasking while driving, which includes use of phone, adjusting mirrors, and selecting music. Do these things while stopped, not while driving.

Calling young women who want to travel and study!

United Women in Faith is accepting applications for the Theressa Hoover Community Service and Global Citizenship Award. The grant is awarded to a lay woman (between the ages of 21–35) who wishes to travel in order to explore and study in a country or region other than the applicant's own.

Priority will be given to projects that explore one of United Women in Faith's social justice priorities:

- **Climate Justice**: Advance just energy for all through advocacy or concrete projects that promote clean, just, renewable energy, energy democracy, and a just and equitable energy transition.
- **Racial Justice**: Ending mass incarceration, stopping the criminalization of communities of color, and/or interrupting the school-to-prison pipeline.

In addition, applicants should demonstrate concern for, and a connection to, their community, as well as a recognition of their global responsibilities.

Applications are due by Tuesday, July 9, 2024.

In 1968 Theressa Hoover was elected chief executive of the Women's Division of the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church. In 1990, United Women in Faith created the Theressa Hoover Community Service and Global Citizenship Award.



Originally from Arkansas, Theressa Hoover joined the Woman's Division of Christian Service as a field worker in 1948. In 1968 she was elected chief executive of the Women's Division of the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church. She was the first African-American woman to hold that position or any comparable post in the denomination. She served as head of the division for 22 years and retired in 1990. Ms. Hoover died at 88 on December 21, 2013, in Fayetteville, Arkansas.

Theressa Hoover leaves behind a legacy. In 2004, *Ebony* magazine named her one of the 100 most influential African-American women, and the Theressa Hoover United Methodist Church in Little Rock, Arkansas, was named for her. In 1990, United Women in Faith created the Theressa Hoover Community Service and Global Citizenship Award. We are grateful to be able to continue Ms. Hoover's passionate work for women and children by passing on the torch of global citizenship with this award.
